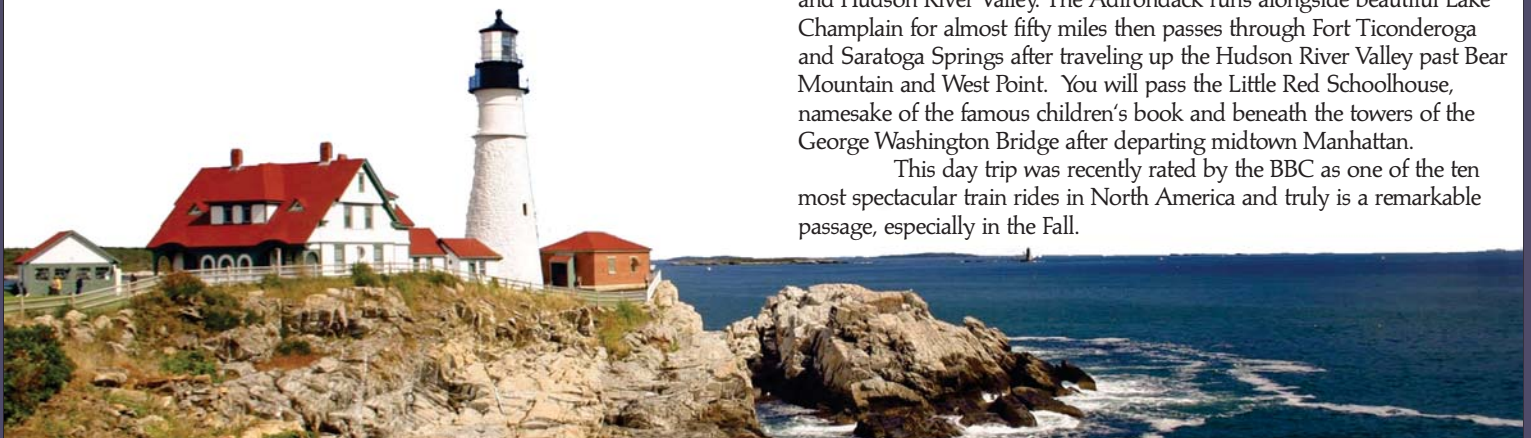

THE 'ADIRONDACK' TRAIN

To offer our guests even more sightseeing of New England at its best, the first feature of this trip is a 'land cruise' aboard the Adirondack train from New York to Montreal during daylight via the Adirondack Mountains and Hudson River Valley. The Adirondack runs alongside beautiful Lake Champlain for almost fifty miles then passes through Fort Ticonderoga and Saratoga Springs after traveling up the Hudson River Valley past Bear Mountain and West Point. You will pass the Little Red Schoolhouse, namesake of the famous children's book and beneath the towers of the George Washington Bridge after departing midtown Manhattan.

This day trip was recently rated by the BBC as one of the ten most spectacular train rides in North America and truly is a remarkable passage, especially in the Fall.
